


Successful Preschool Experience

St. Helena Preschool for All (SPFA) continues to provide opportunities for three and four-year old children to have a successful preschool experience. In 2018 SPFA was able to provide 17 students a scholarship, 12 of those students entered Kindergarten or TK in August. In September, 21 more students were enrolled in a local preschool, making it the highest amount of students enrolled in the program's history. Since the start of the program in 2010 SPFA has provided 130 children and families this opportunity.

Parent Education

Continued focus on providing opportunities for parents of participating families to involve them in the process and educate them in enriching their children's educational experience through monthly educational classes and speakers.



Families also began participating in the Latino Literacy Project, a program that focuses on the importance of literacy through bilingual and culturally relevant books, as part of the new education component.



Community Involvement

Continued involvement in the community in 2018 SPFA participated in the St. Helena Harvest Festival, UpValley Family Center Dia de los Muertos event. Parents volunteered at the Soroptimist Crab Feed Dinner and the St. Helena Rotary Club Annual Kentucky Derby. SPFA was selected for the second year in a row as the beneficiary of "Twelve days of Christmas" an event organized by the Restaurant at Meadowood. SPFA participated in the Napa Valley Give!Guide, an on-line fundraising campaign for the third year.



Family Activities

SPFA held its first annual family Christmas party for the 20 families involved in the preschool program at Nimbus Arts in St. Helena on December 8, 2018. The event was created in collaboration with Nimbus Arts to reflect an afternoon of holiday art projects geared toward preschool age children, their siblings, and families. As part of the 2019-2020 program goals, SPFA plans to host regular activities for the participating children and families, building on their preschool experience in an effort to involve the entire family in enriching educational and community experiences.



2019 GOALS

- Increase our days and hours at Preschools, and **become a year-long program** by continuing to offer preschool to families in the summer.
- Continue to **expand our family activities** and trips to increase community building and engagement amongst the SPFA families.
- Continue to **expand our Parent Education program** to include English classes, job training, and computer training.
- Continue to **establish and develop relationships with community organizations** that can provide support services for our families.


